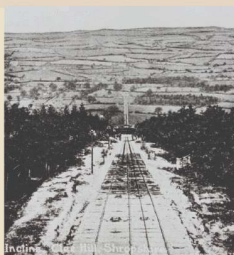

Quarrying some of the hardest rock in the country began here in the 1870s and continues today. Explore the abandoned workings and industrial buildings.



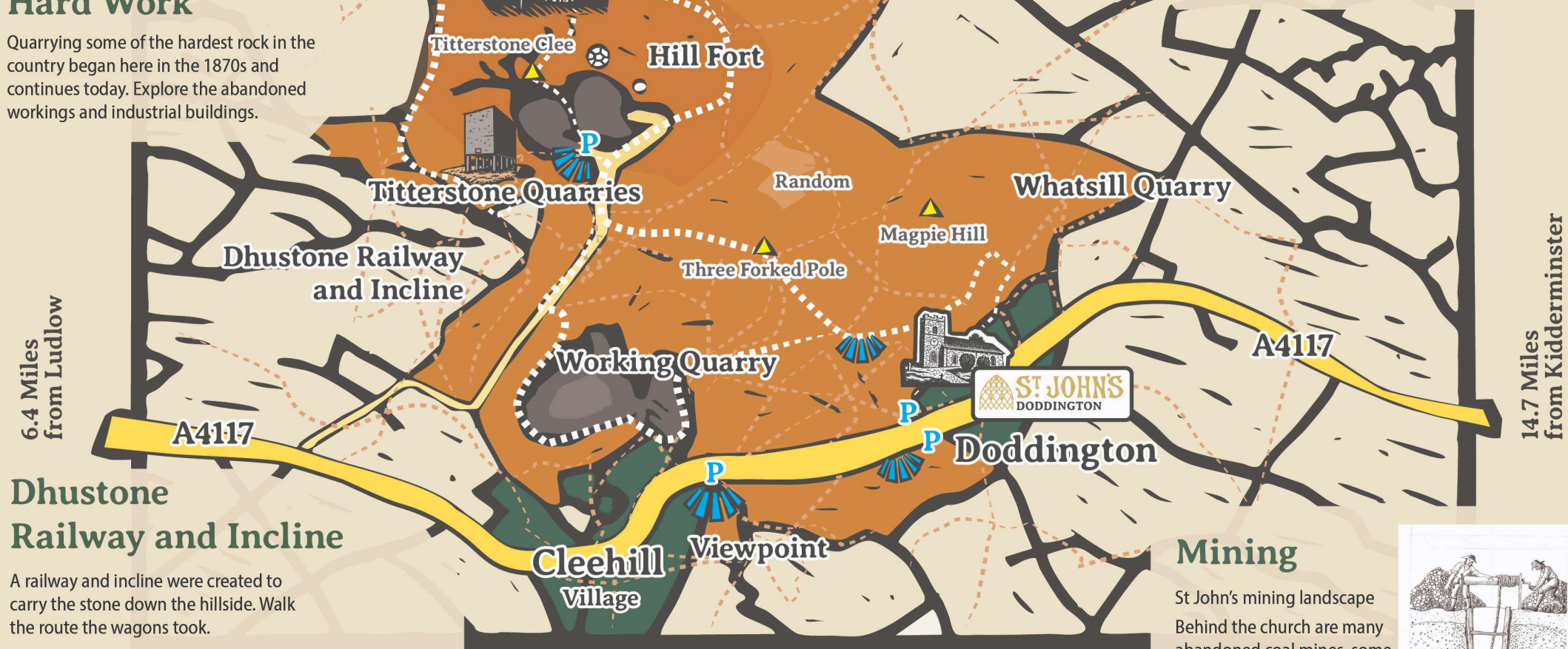
Dhustone Railway and Incline

Easy access to the whole hill

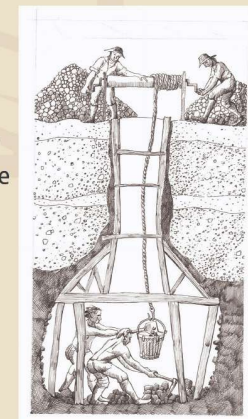
Prehistory

Titterstone has been an important site for millennia. Climb the summit to discover Bronze Age barrows and walk the Iron Age stone ramparts.



Mining

St John's mining landscape. Behind the church are many abandoned coal mines, some dating back to the Medieval period. Walk the paths through this landscape that nature has reclaimed.



Grab a map, sip a brew, step back into history on Clee's summit paths

From a 30 min stroll, to a 20 km hike with a pause midway. Start or finish at the church, grab a hot brew, pick up routes for every ability, and uncover Clee Hill's story.
